What you will need:

RED HEART® Reflective™: 3 balls 8429 Grey A, 2 balls 8671 Neon Green B

Susan Bates® Knitting Needles: 6mm [US 10]

Yarn needle

GAUGE: 24 sts = 4" (10cm); 16 rows = 4" (10cm) in 2x2 Rib. CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.



Red Heart® Reflective™, Art. E820, available in solids 3.5 oz (100 g) 88 yd (80 m) balls



Night Shine Scarf

This yarn reflects the flash of a camera for an amazing way to light up your style! Choose any two colors of this bulky weight yarn and tailor it to the wearer...perfect for a guy or gal!

Scarf measures about 6" (15 cm) wide and 72" (183 cm) long

Pattern Stitch

2x2 Rib (over multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1: *K2, p2; repeat from * to end of row. Repeat Row 1 for 2x2 Rib.

Notes

1. When changing color in 2-row striped sections at beginning and end of scarf, do not cut the old color. To reduce the number of ends to weave in, carry color not in use carefully up side of piece when next needed.
2. When stripes are wider than 2 rows, cut the old yarn and rejoin it when next needed.

SCARF

With A, cast on 36 sts.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 1 row.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 2 rows.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 2 rows.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 2 rows.

Repeat last 4 rows 12 more times until there are fourteen 2-row B-colored stripes.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 4 rows.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 4 rows.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 7 rows.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 7 rows.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib until piece measures about 54" (137 cm) from beginning.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 7 rows.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 7 rows.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 4 rows.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 4 rows.

With B, work in 2x2 Rib for 2 rows.

With A, work in 2x2 Rib for 2 rows.

Repeat last 4 rows 13 more times until there are fourteen 2-row B-colored stripes on this end.

Bind off in rib.

FINISHING

Weave in ends.

ABBREVIATIONS

A and B, C = Color A and Color B; k = knit; p = purl; st(s) = stitch(es); * = repeat whatever follows the *as indicated.
